I also have a meeting with the Provost later this month to discuss the transfer student membership program as well as inclusive curriculums. so hopefully those will go well. also, I have two bills going up today. So, one is the fraternity and sorority inclusivity alliance. this past week I had a meeting with all of the leaders from all of the councils from fraternity authority life and essentially and I'll talk about the bill a little bit later on, but we wanted to brainstorm ways to having for having a more inclusive Greek life space. So, we decided that it would be a good idea to rename one of the old Greek life standing committee that SGA made 2 years ago into an inclusivity alliance that has representatives from each of the councils. so, they can brainstorm on initiatives as well as just to figure out ways that we can make a Greek life more inclusive moving forward and also connect Greek life with administration. so that's one of the one of the things that's going up today. we also have the budget bill going up so you guys can see how we're going to spend the SFAC money that SGA gets every year for fiscal year 21 so that should be interesting as well some other things that we're going to be working on now that we have our budget and stuff ready. I'm hoping to start a COVID-19 Relief Fund so we can buy meal vouchers for food insecure students as well as CAPS vouchers so people can go

and get whatever therapy they might need during this time and we're looking into parking citation relief as well as getting technology for students who may be in need during this time. so hopefully that goes well and we're able to do all of that I also mentioned that I wanted to invest in our third Ward community. So what that looks like is most likely trying to compile a list of historic third ward businesses and finding ways that we can promote their business businesses on the UH community and I'm also going to be meeting with housing sometime this month as well to talk about affordable housing and plans to renovate Moody and all of that. Lastly, we're going to be having our first food drive September 25th if football season doesn't get cancelled and we're going to be meeting 10 volunteers from the Senate. so, if you guys are from the Senate or the exec and are willing to come and volunteer in person at the stadium then we're going to collect food for keeps pantry. so, we can continue to help food insecure students on campus so that's pretty much all the updates that I have. I hope you guys are having a great semester if you need anything at all please don't hesitate to reach out to me, I'm here for y'all. any of the exec members are here for you as well so go ahead and reach out if you guys need anything and enjoy the rest of the meeting. One last thing I have four SFAC people going up for confirmation tonight so as you guys know SFAC student fees advisory committee they decide how your student fee dollars get allocated so it's really important please ask them good questions if you have any and with that enjoy the rest of the meeting.

### II. Report of the Vice-President

I'll take any of y'all an hour before the game starts to 30 minutes after the game is over what we're probably going to be doing is bringing over a table and a tent and a table cloth over to the stadium, setting it up, waiting outside for people to donate canned goods and such and then probably moving those goods to wherever athletics needs us to move it. I believe that's what we're going to be doing but anyway along with that, Jessica has reserved some student center table things for us mostly Wednesdays so I'm going to try and make it here on campus and be able to sit down register people to vote and tell people about SGA and how they can get involved and what we're doing and such like that so if you're interested in that tabling with me or with anyone else who decides to go down to the table then

  - So, this is pretty straightforward y'all. this is just how we're going to use the SGA budget so you guys can see how much each Department is getting because we are going virtual this semester. this year I wanted to give PR the majority of the money so that way that they could produce signs for us they could get the SGA Tshirts and the polos that I know that you guys are really anxious to get as well as the graduation stoles. so that's why they have the majority of the budget everyone else has a pretty standard budget \$2000.00 for the banquet outreach has \$2000.00 for their virtual fence in case they want to buy any like social media ads or in case they want to have any signage on campus as well as any giveaways the office of the president I will say that I know that I will allocate my funds towards buying food vouchers for food insecure students as well as getting CAPS vouchers if we are able to if we are able to purchase technology like laptops for people who may not have them during this time that we're going virtual that will come out of my budget as well but this is pretty straightforward I used the last two administrations budget as kind of a guide for how I wanted to use my budget and as you guys can see all of the red that you see on the budget is things that were not able to control so those are pretty fixed those are student wages as well as our office coordinators wages miss love who does a lot of good work for us and will help us to purchase any of those polos and other marketing items that we may have so yeah as soon as we approve this budget we're going to be able to get you all the merge that you guys I know are waiting for graduation stoles polos T shirts and whatever else you guys want so I yelled the rest of the time for questions there are any.

  - One so this is an initiative that I started when I was a sender essentially I had somebody come to me and tell me that they felt like their rushed or recruitment experience wasn't super inclusive so because of this I decided that we would rename an old standing committee that was created so two years ago one of our great senators he was also a member of SFAC senator Brian started a bill or a standing committee that was the Greek life standing committee and it was supposed to be members of each of the councils on Greek life to kind of connect them to SGA but there wasn't a whole lot of follow up on that initiative so we didn't really have a very active standard committee so I decided that in the light of the black lives matter movement and all of the outreach that we've seen in the social justice movement that we renamed the standing committee the fraternity and sorority life inclusivity alliance and so this is kind of modeled over what Vanderbilt has which is very similar they essentially have members from each of the committees that are committed to inclusivity initiatives so that's what I kind of decided to do so I had a meeting with all of the leaders of Greek lives including some of the administrators and I presented the idea for the bill and none of the leaders had any opposition to it they were in support of it so I decided to go along with this initiative and rename the current standing committee that we have the fraternity and sorting life inclusive the alliance and have two members from each of the five governing councils to be on it as well as a staff member or their designee and so the goal of this committee is to one connect Greek life to administration so we saw the NP HC petition happened over the summer for those of you who might not know what that is NPHC is one of the Greek councils that we have at you age and they were they had some concerns about over policing of their organization on campus so we were able to create a committee that director of outreach when was on an also due to staff white was on to kind of combat that and they actually standardize the process for how many security officers we would have at Greek events which is really great but this was something that N PhD was trying to work on for a very long time and they really had no traction on it so I figured if we created this alliance not just to promote inclusivity initiatives but also connect Greek councils to administration they could streamline any concerns or grievances that they might have with the way that things are run so that way we could not have to wait you know 2-3 years for things to actually happen for things to change because we saw that when we have a connection to administration it's a lot easier for initiatives to get done so I figured not only is renamed this and trying to get it more active away that people are able to grieve or people are able to kind of voice their concerns but they are also able to maybe create some initiatives that benefit the Greek community as a whole because I

know that I served on the panhellenic exact last year and that was one of the goals that I had was to how do we how do we Unite Greek life how do we Unite all of the Greek councils that we have so I told them a few initiatives I'll give you one example just so you guys know one initiative that I thought that maybe this council could work on was creating a kind of cougar closet of sorts for people in Greek lives not everyone in Greek life is able to afford all the clothes that are needed for formals or fair maybe recruitment or initiation so I figured that maybe one of the things that the council could work on is maybe creating a closet of borrowing closet of swords where people who may have old formal dresses or suits they could leave those at the CFL office and then people who can't afford them could maybe borrow them for those events so they don't have to go and purchase new clothing because I know that was a problem that I had in my time in Greek life and so that was one of the examples we had other ones as well but essentially what this bill does is renamed the current standing coming that we have and make it more active so the next steps after hopefully this gets passed in two weeks is to create an application and send that out to all of the Greek councils and I have gotten no verbal confirmation from all of the leaders that they'll advertise it an A few have told me that they already have some people in mind for the council so I have talked to Greek life about this before.

XVI. UB – 57003 Contractor and Subcontractor Employee Protections Act (Vote)

Discussing this bill for a couple of meetings now but for those senators who are new just for context there is an issue between employees of subcontractors and contractors that were working on the new quad residence project that is now completed on campus where they were there was a dispute about wages an initial group of nine of those employees brought a claim against the contractors and it took almost a year for that to be resolved but now that those nine have gone in the settlement on their claim there's now more people who are coming forward regarding wage disputes as well and it's like a lot of people and so this bill essentially started as a resolute resolution saying we stand with those workers and that we want to support them in every way that we can thanks to our faculty sponsored Keith we were able to get a meeting with general counsel to talk about how we can make concrete steps towards something productive and so this build essentially outlines that there's going to be a work group that's formed between workers students contractor representatives you each administration and what not to see what internal policies on the University level we can implement so that we do not have a situation like this happen again where there has to be all this publicity just to resolve an issue of our wage dispute and so that whenever complaints are filed that there's actually an effective process for dealing with those complaints and resolving them so that's what this bill does an IA we kind of tweaked it from the last time but there are very minor tweaks it mainly just specified that there would be students on this work group and then also established a timeline for 30 days after the resolution is sent to the appropriate admin or administrators that within the 30 days the workgroup would have its first meeting and we would start the process for all that stuff so yeah you should have received the language of that.

  - That's when you status as she wanted to so you can explain the answer making sure he guys so thank you to everyone who would be able to have dialogue with us about the spell you know so it's very important for us to understand what the provisions mean but the motivation is and you know the real impact that it will have and you know we reached out to a lot of people as well as the Senate and we're glad that we were able to have a lot of dialogue about it and then replied very able to get vitamin sponsorships so basically what this bill does is it doesn't change a legal provision that exists all it does is it takes existing off that already applies that she is bound by and it puts it in the election code so that candidates who may not know about it won't fall victim to a lot it's important to understand that these are legal provisions that are already in law that SJ has to follow its in RSA constitution as well we have our own Bill of Rights in our constitution and the first provision in that says that it is required to follow all applicable federal and state law including the US constitution to Texas State so that already exists all we're doing is given that certain legal rulings were made in the past election we're putting it in the election code so that people know about it a vote yes to this bill is a vote yes to ensuring that people can know about the provisions about note to this bill doesn't change the law all it does is it makes it so that the law is now in different places but this was still exists right on the Supreme Court website all of our opinions are there the only thing is given that you have opinions and you have the election code and you have the bylaws and whatnot it's best to ensure that they are as consistent that's all we're trying to do now we do understand that there are some individuals affected and I think it's very important that we address that we're glad that most individuals are reached out to us and had good dialogue for those of us couldn't find there are some who are worried that this bill will promote hate speak and that is not true for a few reasons first all this does is it details existing framework that already exists for how individuals can prosecute different speech right neither it doesn't promote hate speech and it doesn't even say that hates because legally protected because that's not true either we layout certain provisions for when speech can be enforced speech that is libelous slanderous defamatory or containing imminent threats bodily harm or within the scope of

someone acting as an agent of SGA is within the scope of SGA's regulation meaning of hate speech falls under these categories that is actionable but with that in mind we also I think it's important that everyone you know is comfortable you know I know that some individuals had concerns that voting yes to this bill might make it seem like SGA condone certain things and although this bill doesn't do that and although we have other provisions in our current election code and constitution that are exactly what we're doing here we do understand that that's a legitimate concern and So what we propose is we definitely support SGA's effort wants to pass a resolution now or closer to the election this position any credibility that way you have illegal clarification so that new candidates and don't fall victim to a lot they don't know because you know I've been in three administrations this is really been recurring issue important to have as much clarity as possible so you ensure that that happens while also ensuring that SGA's position is unequivocally against speech that you know hurts anybody so I wouldn't mind bill it's just specifically genuine clarification of our election code for future candidates and president candidates so we hope you champion the cause of verification and the free access of information questions

are afraid to share they are afraid to have discourse with people about ideas that we all should be talking about because they're afraid of how people will perceive that are afraid of being attacked they're afraid of being labeled and this happens on both sides right I mean if you support Bernie Sanders people call you a communist but you support trump people call you a big without really getting to the bottom of why individuals have different views and how we can learn from each other's experiences So what I'm doing is I'm working with the professor I mean we're doing an initiative that seeks to implement the curriculum where we can better understand why our minds are so resistant to having productive digital and in the process of doing that we hope to get better at it you know we have we're doing a pilot program right now we have a group of about 7 extremely talented students who all have different ideas and beliefs we're going to we're getting together and collectively exploring these ideas and administration is watching us as well and so ultimately you know if that ends up becoming bigger I'll let y'all know I hope it does but that's really what I'm trying to do you know and with that in mind I do want to leave you guys with a few parting thoughts um there's been really a lot that I've learned from working with different administrations and I would say the three biggest things that it's important for any effective administration for our operation humility and selfless action cooperation means you see each other as intelligent individuals irrespective of how different your user you know it's when you ask why different individuals disagree instead of projecting what when you can work together speak with each other not at each other and show respect for each other respective of how contentious the issues second as members of SG all of you are I would say servants which servants to a higher cause your servants to the student body and the key attribute of a servant is humility being able to put everyone else first recognizing that students are not accountable to you are accountable to them recognizing that they controlled you not the other way around recognizing that every action you take is in service of them not the other way around and I think that's something you all everybody greatly Lastly it's important to work for the sake of work itself you know success and failure are really things that are going to happen in life right like going into this today you know we knew that there's probably a good chance that bill wouldn't pass and we're grateful that actually got as much support as it did you know we're grateful that we had those conversations but ultimately success and failure a lot of times aren't going to be in our hands so we just have to ensure that we put in the work that we can the best we can and leave the result up to our environment um and not let it affect our mental health and our and our mental stability you know with that in mind I respect every single one of you are doing great have great leaders in this committee and I look forward to seeing you all accomplished that might take care before speaking with you guys more in the
