



Faculty Position, Rank Open

The School of Social Work, University of Missouri-Columbia, announces an open-rank, 9-month, tenure/tenure-track faculty position currently available. Candidates should be able to 1) maintain an active research agenda leading to publication in peer-reviewed journals, 2) obtain federal grants or other external funds for state agency or community-based research partnerships, 3) develop multidisciplinary research connections on and off the MU campus, and 4) teach across the curriculum with particular emphasis on evidence-based clinical practice and service delivery.

Minimum requirements are a doctoral degree in social work, social welfare, or a closely related field. An MSW degree from an accredited social work program and two years post-MSW social work practice experience are preferred. Evidence of success in scholarly productivity, external funding of research, and teaching competence is desirable at the assistant level and required at the associate/full professor levels. Capacity to contribute expertise to one or both of the School's two Graduate Certificate Programs (Gerontology and Military Social Work) is also sought. Other areas that contribute to the School's mission of social and economic justice are welcome, including health disparities, child welfare service delivery, and mental health.

The School offers degrees at the BSW, MSW, and PhD levels, and is developing MSW/MPH and MSW/JD dual-degree programs.
