Job Description: The position is primarily responsible for identifying and screening young adults(ages 18-24) who are living with HIV/AIDS are homeless and who are have dual diagnoses assessing for chemical dependency. The purpose of the Licensed Chemical Dependency Counselor/Life Skills Specialist (LCDC/LSS) is to provide the appropriate evidence -based interventions, life skills development and substance abuse counseling for participants to support their ability to achieve employment, stable housing and medical adherence. LCDC/LSS performs initial and on-going chemical dependency assessments on current participants to support their ability to manage their dependency.

Qualifications: Licensed Chemical Dependency Counselor (LCDC) required. A Bachelor's degree in social work, sociology or related field of study preferred or in lieu of a degree, three to four years experience in a field of social services. A minimum of two years experience providing case management or related services to disabled individuals, youth at-risk, young adults and/or populations experiencing homelessness is preferred.
