Minimum Qualifications: MSW; completed Doctorate in Social Work preferred. Extensive BSW and/or MSW practice, leadership and/or teaching experience; excellent communicator; collegial work style and commitment to the interests of the School and the profession; demonstrated record of publications, scholarship, teaching and service sufficient to warrant a tenure track appointment as an Assistant or Associate Professor. Competence and interest in the area of social work practice with communities, community organizing, community development, program evaluation, and international social work from a macro perspective. The successful candidate will have a demonstrated commitment to advancing social justice and human rights.

Duties: Teaching across the curriculum in both BSW and MSW courses, including community practice courses, practice courses in the International and Community Development Concentration and our unique Human Rights and Social Justice advanced core courses, assisting the School in meeting all aspects of CSWE reaccreditation guidelines, conducting ongoing research and writing, advising students, and collaborating on University and School issues and committees.

The University: Monmouth is a private non sectarian university located in West Long Branch, New Jersey. The University is located less than one mile from the Atlantic Ocean, and one and one half hours from either New York City or Philadelphia. The student body is diverse. Although most students come from New Jersey, 19 States and 35 nations are represented.

The School of Social Work has maintained an accredited BSW Program since 1975 and in Fall 1998 began its MSW Program (accredited 2000) with concentrations in International and Community Development and Clinical Practice with Families and Children.
