Applications are now being accepted for the vacancies listed and will be accepted until these open positions are filled. Qualified applicants will be considered on a first-come, first-serve basis. All applicants for employment will be required to produce as a part of the application process, proof of employment authorization and positive proof of identification.

TELEMEDICINE PSYCHIATRIC PROVIDER (P #1499) – A.H. - EAST TEXAS BEHAVIORAL HEALTHCARE NETWORK, LUFKIN, TEXAS

GENERAL DESCRIPTION: Provision of psychiatric services to adults (may include some child and adolescent coverage). No relocation is necessary for this position.

EDUCATION:

Required: Completion of accredited program in your area of specialty.

LICENSES/CERTIFICATIONS:

Required: Licensed in the State of Texas as a Physician, Advanced Practice Nurse or Physician Assistant.

Preferred: Current unrestricted Texas license to practice medicine; Board eligibility in Child & Adolescent Psychiatry. Board Certification in Child & Adolescent Psychiatry; Board Certification in General Psychiatry.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION: The Clinical Coordinator is responsible for providing team leadership and supervision to all clinical personnel. Duties include leading and facilitating the multi-disciplinary treatment team; providing and facilitating emergency and mental health assessments for clients; monitoring the clinical admission and discharge criteria; authorizing, supervising, and maintaining intervention/case management services; and assisting the Service Director in clinical service delivery. Duties also include but are not limited to supervising mental health clinicians, intake worker and interns, conducting training sessions, attending community meetings, interviewing staff for vacant positions, and reviewing/analyzing billing reports and other duties as assigned by the Service Director. The position is under the direct supervision of the Service Director.

MENTAL HEALTH TRAINING CLINICAL COORDINATOR (P #1523) - J.S. – LUFKIN/NACOGDOCHES/LIVINGSTON, TEXAS

GENERAL DESCRIPTION: This position is responsible for developing and implementing educational and training programs for the Burke Center mental health division. The education and training will be primarily for personnel inclusive of, but not necessarily limited to, new employee clinical orientation; service and case coordination skills, duties and service delivery; rehabilitation skills and service delivery; mental health screening and assessment (including crisis assessment); and clinical documentation. This position will also assist in developing as well as conducting other miscellaneous CEU programs and will maintain/update the online training and monitoring system. The position will provide direct care to individuals as needed to maintain state training credentialing. The training specialist will also be engaged in follow-up monitoring and evaluation of trainee's implementation of learned skill sets; as well as, monitoring and evaluating protocols within service delivery systems. The position serves as the agencies suicide prevention coordinator. This position reports to the Director of Operations and is part of the Mental Health Operations Support Team. Primary office location can be in Livingston, Nacogdoches, or Lufkin Texas.

EDUCATION:

Required: Master's degree in Psychology, Social Work, Marriage and Family Therapy or Counseling from an accredited college or university.

EXPERIENCE:

Required: One (1) year of full-time experience delivering mental health care services at a Texas LMHA (Community Center) setting.

Preferred: In addition to the above, some experience doing education/training of individuals and/or groups of people.

LICENSES/CERTIFICATIONS:

Required: Licensed Professional Counselor Intern (LPC-I), Licensed Marriage and Family Therapist Associate (LMFTA) or Licensed Master Social Worker currently working towards their LCSW, with the State of Texas. GENERAL DESCRIPTION: This position provides direct clinical services, predominantly advanced individual and group therapy services to children, adolescents and adults. Duties may include completing diagnostic evaluations and comprehensive treatment plans; providing Head Start assessments, providing and facilitating emergency and mental health assessments; monitoring the clinical admission and discharge criteria; authorizing and maintaining intervention/case management services; and assisting the clinical coordinators in clinical service delivery. GENERAL DESCRIPTION: The Crisis Mental Health Clinician, as a member of a multi-disciplinary team, will provide direct care rehabilitative services to adults on the Extended Observation and Crisis Residential Units. These programs operate 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Duties will include, but may not be limited to the following: conducting mental health and admission assessments; providing group and individual rehabilitative services; developing treatment plans; discharge planning; and providing safety monitoring for clients admitted to these programs. Will perform services according to an individual's approved and prescribed treatment plan and in accordance with Center and Medicaid standards and requirements. Proficient and timely documentation skills are required. Self-discipline, flexibility, and time-organization skills are a must. Performs under the direction of the Program Director of the Crisis Residential Program.

EDUCATION:

Required: Bachelor's degree in Social Work, Psychology, Rehabilitation or other Human Services discipline that meets QMHP requirements, from an accredited college or university.

Preferred: Bachelor's degree in Social Work.

EXPERIENCE:

Preferred: Six (6) month's direct care experience working with adults in a behavioral healthcare or mental health setting. Familiarity with DSM-IV diagnostic criteria.

LICENSES/CERTIFICATIONS:

Required: Valid Texas driver's license.

SPECIAL REQUESTS OR COMMENTS:

Required: Must be physically able to complete Satori Alternatives to Managing Aggression (SAMA), CPR, First Aid, and Defensive Driving training modules. Must have a driving record insurable by the Center's insurance administrator. Must have reliable personal vehicle and travel routinely within the service area.

PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS: Sight, hearing, talking, lifting up to 50 pounds, prolonged standing, walking, driving a vehicle, and hand/finger dexterity.

HOURS: Staff in this position will work 12-hour shifts (7:00am to 7:00pm) with a total of 7 shifts every 14 days. Will be required to work every other weekend and some holidays on a rotating basis.

SALARY: \$32,000 - \$33,300 annually, depending on shifts worked, qualifications and experience. Travel reimbursement provided.

MENTAL HEALTH CLINICIAN (P #1505) – S.B. – MOBILE CRISIS OUTREACH TEAM; LUFKIN, TEXAS

GENERAL DESCRIPTION: The Mobile Crisis Outreach Team (MCOT) Mental Health Clinician works closely with other MCOT members to provide immediate and intensive response to persons in crisis and to persons needing urgent care that are at high risk of becoming emergent and potentially needing inpatient care. The MCOT goal is to provide screening and assessment for persons in need, and to provide intensive interventions aimed at de-escalating the crisis and, whenever possible, diverting hospitalization. MCOT service is also inclusive of providing support and transport to individuals identified as in need of external support to maintain rehabilitation, case management and medication services as an enrolled mental health patient. The MCOT personnel will work a forty (40) hour week with an evening schedule, inclusive of weekend and holiday rotation coverage. This position will report to the MCOT Clinical Coordinator. Proficient and timely documentation skills required. Self-discipline, flexibility, and time-organization skills are a must. This position will regularly require travel within a limited area of the Burke Center service region but is stationed in Lufkin, Texas.

EDUCATION:

Required: Bachelor's degree in Social Work, Psychology, Rehabilitation or other Human Services discipline that meets QMHP requirements, from an accredited college or university.

EXPERIENCE:

Preferred: Six (6) months' continuous full-time direct care experience in an adult mental health setting, inclusive of some mental health crisis evaluation and intervention.

LICENSES/CERTIFICATIONS:

Required: Valid Texas driver's license.

Preferred: LSW.

SPECIAL REQUESTS OR COMMENTS:

Required: Must be physically able to complete Satori Alternatives to Managing Aggression (SAMA), CPR, First Aid, and Defensive Driving training modules. Must have a reliable mode of transportation and a driving record insurable by the Center's insurance administrator.

MENTAL HEALTH CLINICIAN (P #1383) – C.B. - ANGELINA MENTAL HEALTHCARE CENTER, LUFKIN TEXAS

GENERAL DESCRIPTION: The Mental Health Clinician will provide direct care rehabilitative services to individual adults enrolled in services with chronic mental illness in the office and community/home settings. Will perform services according to the individual's approved and prescribed rehabilitation plan, and according to Center and Medicaid standards and requirements. This worker will perform emergency assessment duties as needed. Proficient and timely documentation skills required. Self-discipline, flexibility, and time-organization skills are a must. Service provision will occur to individuals residing in Angelina, Trinity, Houston, Jasper, Newton, and Sabine Counties. Performs under the supervision of the unit Clinical Coordinator. This position will require some travel to remote areas.

EDUCATION:

Required: Bachelor's degree in Social Work, Psychology, Rehabilitation or other Human Services discipline that meets QMHP requirements, from an accredited college or university.

EXPERIENCE:

Preferred: Six (6) month's direct care experience working with adults in a behavioral healthcare or mental health setting. Familiarity with DSM IV diagnostic criteria.

LICENSES/CERTIFICATIONS:

Required: Valid Texas driver's license.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION: The LVN will be part of a multidisciplinary treatment team and is responsible for providing nursing care services to acutely mentally ill adult residents at the Extended Observation Unit and the Crisis Residential Unit. These units operate 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Performs under the direct supervision of the registered nurse on duty. Duties will include, but may not be limited to giving injections, administering oral medications, monitoring the health status of resident clients, completing medication consents, assisting with psychiatric services provided via telehealth equipment, general nursing duties and coordinating health care needs with other medical care providers. Other responsibilities may include inventory of medications, patient education and documentation, collection of lab specimens

EDUCATION:

Required: Graduation from an accredited school of nursing and licensed as a Vocational Nurse by the Texas State Board of Licensed Vocational examiners.

EXPERIENCE:

Preferred: One (1) year experience working in a mental health setting.
