



Lecturer of Human Services Technology - Non-Tenure-Track (with benefits)

The Ohio University Lancaster Campus is seeking a Lecturer of Human Services Technology, a part-time, renewable non-tenure track position, to begin on January 2, 2015. The HST program prepares generalists with the knowledge and skills applicable to a variety social services settings, such as social services, corrections, mental health and substance abuse. The degree also allows students to apply for the Social Work Assistant registration through the Ohio Counselor and Social Worker Board upon completion of required coursework. Teaching load for this position is 24 semester hours or its equivalent per academic year. Courses to be taught include Introduction to Human Services Technology, Crisis Intervention, Behavior Management, Group Dynamics and Chemical Dependency among others. There may be the possibility of teaching courses in the Social Work program which is also offered on the campus. Faculty will be expected to coordinate and direct practicum experiences for students. The position may require teaching at another Ohio University campus or center, or through distance media as campus and program needs determine. Utilization of educational media and technology is expected in the development and delivery of courses. Additional responsibilities may include coordinating the HST program at Ohio University Lancaster, including class scheduling and staffing, student recruitment, advising, placement, program evaluation, and development.

Master's Degree in Social Work is required. Minimum of three years work experience in social work/counseling, administrative/supervisory and/or teaching experience required. Demonstrated excellence in teaching and participation in professional development are also required. Candidates must be dedicated to the mission of the regional campus.

The Ohio University Lancaster Campus is located about 25 miles south-east of Columbus and 45 miles north of the main campus in Athens. Over 2,500 traditional and nontraditional students enroll each semester in associate's, bachelor's and master's degree programs at the Lancaster Campus and Pickerington Center. The Ohio University Lancaster community strives to create an educational and cultural environment in which students refine their abilities to reason and communicate clearly, so as to become responsible citizens in a diverse world.
