Job Description

• Northern Arizona University Social Work Program invites applications for Assistant Clinical Professor in Social Work with Northern Arizona University - Yuma Campus, Yuma, AZ, beginning August 2012. This is a nine-month, non-tenure track position; responsibilities include teaching four (4) undergraduate social work courses per semester that constitute a mix of face-to-face and web-based delivery, student mentoring, and service activities. The position is a one academic year contract with opportunity for renewal beyond AY 2012-2013, contingent upon effective performance, the continued availability of funds, and program needs.

- Winter and Summer teaching may be available for additional compensation.
- Candidates with a demonstrated commitment supportive of the diverse, multicultural needs of the communities served by the program are strongly desired.

Minimum Qualifications

- Master of Social Work degree from a CSWE accredited program.

- Minimum of two years of post-MSW practice experience.
- Evidence of college or university level teaching experience as a teaching assistant and/or primary course instructor.
- Demonstrated experience or expressed willingness to work in a diverse university community.

Preferred Qualifications

- Doctorate in social work or related field from a regionally accredited institution.
- Three or more years of post-MSW practice experience.
- Post-MSW practice experience in rural areas.
- Two or more years of successful college or university teaching experience.
- Demonstrated ability to teach social work courses across the curriculum.
- Demonstrated ability to mentor students.
- Experience in working with Indigenous Populations of the Southwest, particularly the Hispanic population.
- Demonstrated competence in social work practice and a generalist social work orientation.
- Demonstrated ability to promote and maintain collaborative partnerships with human service agencies, faculty, and community groups to develop appropriate field placement opportunities for students in the BSW Program.
- Demonstrated ability to teach using web-based technologies.
- Demonstrated ability to work effectively within a diverse university community.
