ACT Case Manager MHRT/C - Portland Help Center

Portland Help Center is a small professional multidisciplinary outpatient psychiatric treatment team. We are seeking a dynamic case manager with strong adult mental health experience. Must have MHRT/C and preferably Drug and Alcohol Counselor Certification and Employment Specialist Certification. We are located in downtown Portland. Our clinic has been in operation since 1990. Experienced MHRT/C to provide ACT case management services to adults with serious and persistent mental illness in order to promote their integration into the community, achieve symptom stability and encourage relapse prevention. Clean driving history and reliable transportation necessary. BSW or BA degree in a closely related field with conditional MHRT/C or full MHRT/C certification. CADC preferable. ES preferable. Education Tech III - Brunswick

Educational Technician III - Lewiston/Auburn

Educational Technician III needed to work 1:1 with students with emotional, behavioral, and/or developmental challenges at our Auburn program. Must be able to work in a team-oriented environment and support delivery of academic programming. Candidates must possess Maine DOE Ed-Tech certification and have at least 90 college credit hours; a 4-year degree is preferred. A background in education is desirable.

Educational Technician III - School Based Behavioral Health Professional

We are a therapeutic preschool program that services children ages 3 to 5 years. We are currently seeking full time professionals to work in our classrooms for children diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorder. We provide 1:1 support and individualized programming for children and employ a variety of systematic relationship based, behavioral, sensory and visual interventions. We provide a high level of structure, repetition and predictability throughout the daily routine in a classroom of between 5-7 children. The daily routine looks a lot like that of a typical preschool routine, where children engage in group circle time, movement and center activities and have snack, lunch and outside times. The focus of staff is on structuring the activities in such a way (with visual supports and other adaptations) so that all of the children can be successful and participate. Also built into the day are individualized work sessions with 1-2 children in order to pre-teach skills to children that will help them to be more successful in classroom activities. Staff work closely with speech, occupational and physical therapists to create and maintain comprehensive, coordinated treatment. Behavioral Health Professionals/Educational Technicians, under the supervision of the classroom teacher, are responsible for implementing and tracking the effectiveness of individualized interventions and children's progress in a variety of developmental areas, including communication, social, play, pre-academic, self-help/adaptive (e.g. toileting, hygiene, feeding) and regulation (behavioral, emotional and sensory) skills. All staff are provided with intensive Therapeutic Crisis Intervention training upon hire and will receive ongoing trainings and supervision throughout employment.

Family Reunification Team Leader - Washington/Hancock Counties

Seeking full-time Master's level clinician for Family Reunification Program serving families involved in the Child Welfare system. Responsibilities include service planning for families and individuals, and crisis response to families working to reunify with their children following a child welfare placement, or to prevent removal from the home. Successful candidates will have clinical experience with families with complex needs and working in home-based settings. Experience with child welfare systems and evidence based practice models preferred. Ability to work non-traditional hours, evenings and weekends is required. Extensive travel in the two country catchment area. Engage families in treatment and provide professional reality oriented, strength based, solution focused interventions. Conduct sessions with family and individual family members. Maintain communication with family support workers. Maintain required case records including assessments, family plans, and closing summaries. Develop family plan and coordinate service goal. Support family by providing/arranging transportation, resources, and community linkages for therapeutic or other family needs. Court reporting/testimony as needed. Provide supportive intervention beyond traditional working hours, and be part of a team this available 24 hours per day, 7 days per week to address family needs, including crises. A Masters degree is required, preferably in social work, or a Master's degree in a human services area with a minimum of one year of in-home direct service experience in a child welfare field. An LSW/C is permitted when enrolled in a Master's degree program in social work or in a human service area, with a minimum of one year of in-home direct service experience in a child welfare field.
