

ASSISTANT OR ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR OF SOCIAL WORK

The social work (BSW) program at Central Michigan University is seeking a tenure-track social work faculty member for an academic year appointment at the associate or assistant professor level beginning in August, 2014. The requirements for the position are an MSW from a CSWE-accredited institution, and a PhD or doctorate in social work by August 2014. The successful candidate must have two years of post-MSW practice experience or a plan to acquire this experience by the time of a tenure decision. Rank is commensurate upon experience. The successful candidate must also have excellent scholarly potential including a research and publication agenda. Demonstrated evidence of effective teaching is required. Faculty responsibilities will include teaching several core courses in the social work program, advisement of students, and related social work program service responsibilities. Preference will be given to candidates who have recent experience teaching in social work and can teach practice and/or research methods and Human Behavior and the Social Environment. Preference may also be given to candidates with administrative experience and curriculum development experience, who might at some later point be considered for the Program Director position. The program, which is CSWE-accredited, teaches generalist practice, with an emphasis on rural settings. The program and the university are also committed to increasing opportunities for global experiences. The faculty in the social work program and the department has many interdisciplinary interests, and a common theme of those interests is social justice. The position is in a joint department of 30 faculty with undergraduate programs in social work, sociology, and anthropology. Teaching load is nine hours per semester with a one course reduction for the first year. Candidates should apply via on-line submission of a letter of application, curriculum vitae, statement of record of diversity-related service, copies of official transcripts, and evidence of teaching effectiveness. Three confidential letters of recommendation are required, and must be sent directly to Dr. Katherine Rosier, Department Chair, 142 Anspach Hall, Department of Sociology, Anthropology and Social Work, Central Michigan University, Mount Pleasant, Michigan 48859.
