Qualifications: Eligible applicants must have a terminal degree in Social Work or a related field from a regionally accredited university and a MSW degree from a Council on Social Work Education (CSWE) accredited program. The successful candidate is expected to have expertise in one or more of the following practice areas: clinical social work; international social work, aging populations, substance abuse, mental health, and/or services to children and families. Expertise in research and services to military families is desirable. Practice and teaching experience in the micro area of direct services to individuals, families, and groups and knowledge of NeuroScience and social work practice are desirable. Candidates should have advising and mentoring experience across programs, as well as a record of scholarly achievements appropriate for the rank of appointment.
