Residential Social Worker – Cornville

Your duties will include psychosocial assessments; individual treatment planning; group therapy; classroom observation to gather information about a client's response to the environment; consultation with the treatment team; and social brokerage. Documentation requirements include timely submission of APS managed care entries for Maine clients, clinical documentation, and discharge and transition planning. All applicants must have at least a Maine state LMSW-cc or equivalent. LCSW or LCPC preferred. New graduates will be considered, and supervision is provided. Live-in Residential Direct Care Team - Various Maine Locations

What does the ideal team look like? There is no set definition. Mother/daughter (over the age of 18), married couples or unmarried couples, partners, or friends are a few examples. As long as you qualify for the job, we want you to apply. High school diploma or GED required. You must have a valid driver's license, your own vehicle and a clean driving history for the past three (3) years. Placement depends on needs at the time of hire. Both members of the team must fill out separate applications. Relevant experience is helpful, but not necessary.

Educational Technician III -Brunswick, Casco, Chelsea, Cornville (Temp & FT), Lewiston/Auburn, South Portland (Roosevelt)

Our ideal full time, Maine DOE-certified Educational Technician III will be an integral part of the classroom, and should be passionate about improving the delivery of programming to our students, making therapeutic relationships and setting consistent limits. You will learn to think critically and work well as part of a treatment team through the school year and a seven week extended program. The exact classroom assignment of the candidate depends upon the skills and experience of the applicant pool. You must have, or be eligible for, Maine Educational Technician III certification by completing at least 90 credit hours of college work. Public School Counselor – Gardiner High School

Gardiner High School (MSAD 11) has an immediate opening for a School-Based Clinician. Our public school counselors provide mental health services to students with identified needs, from their office in the school. You'll work in partnership with the educational staff, helping students succeed in school and in life. We'll provide our new clinician with training and supervision to support licensing requirements and professional development. As our School-Based Clinician, you'll provide individual and family therapy, and comply with documentation requirements. Experience with evidence-based practices is desired, and energy and creativity are essential. Applicants must be Maine licensed LCSW, LCPC, or their conditional clinical counterparts.

Home Community Treatment Clinician - Auburn

As a Home Community Treatment Clinician, you'll provide family therapy to parents and their children experiencing serious emotional, behavioral or developmental challenges, in partnership with a Behavioral Health Professional (BHP). You should have training and/or experience with evidence-based interventions including, but not limited to, Trauma-focused CBT, CBT, and Collaborative Problem Solving. The candidate we hire will collaborate with the family, team members and providers, and be willing to work a flexible schedule to accommodate family members who need to be present for family-based treatment, as well as crisis and prevention planning. This is both a home and community-based service. A Master's degree in Human Services, Social Work, Counseling or Psychology is required, in addition to Maine licensure. LCSW, LCPC, LMFT or their conditional clinical counterparts will be accepted. You will supervise Educational Technicians, and use a relational milieu therapy model through the school year and a seven week extended program. Experience working with children presenting emotional, learning and behavioral issues is desired, as is design of individualized programs for multi-handicapped students. Please have a minimum of an Associate's degree in social services, health or education. Bachelor's degree preferred. Also have one or more years of experience working in an educational or social services environment, with direct contact with children, clients or families. We need one specialist each in the following areas: southern/western Maine, central Maine, and from Augusta to the mid-coast.

Public School Counselor- Lewiston Middle School

Lewiston Middle School has a large multicultural population so experience with culturally competent mental health is preferred. At a minimum a willingness and energy to learn culturally competent practice. Employees work in partnership with the educational staff, helping students succeed in school and in life. We provide all employees with training and supervision to support licensing requirements and professional development. Duties include providing individual and family therapy to adolescents and their families. Compliance with documentation to meet licensing and agency requirements. Applicants must be licensed in the state of Maine as an LCSW, LMSWcc, LCPC, LCPCc.

Case Manager - Alternative Response Program - Westbrook & Biddeford

Our evidence-based divisions in southern Maine seek 2 full-time, bachelor's level LSW or LSW-cc candidate to work closely with families in their homes, to assess strengths and risks related to potential child protective issues. This is a temporary position through December 31, 2012. Engage the family at the onset of services, conduct risk assessments, develop a family plan to decrease risks and enhance family stability. You will make referrals to needed services and resources, and monitor the well-being of family members throughout your time with them. You must be highly organized; work effectively with colleagues, supervisors and other case managers; demonstrate your writing skills; and have the flexibility to meet with families in their homes, occasionally beyond normal working hours. Please have experience serving youth and families in crisis, or who require knowledge, advocacy and/or support to reduce risk.

CULTURAL BROKER – Auburn

Our Home Community Treatment team needs a part-time Cultural Broker from the Somali community to work as a Behavioral Health Professional (BHP) in the Lewiston/Auburn area. You'll work with a clinician, providing home-based services to Somali children and families impacted by trauma and experiencing behavioral challenges with their children. Part of your job will be helping the families understand and utilize the mental health system, helping them overcome the linguistic and cultural challenges. Our hope is not only to reduce barriers for these families, but to increase understanding and tolerance in the community and create family teams that are sensitive to cultural differences. Our successful Cultural Broker will know and implement family Individual Service Plans, use positive role modeling, skill building interventions and develop behavior management plans with families. You'll need excellent organizational skills, and will be expected to comply with billable hours expectations and documentation. A Bachelor's degree in social services, health or education is required. Applicants must possess a valid driver's license and reliable vehicle to be considered for this position. BHP training and certification will be provided upon hire.
