

Metropolitan State University Faculty Position

We are located near downtown St. Paul, Minnesota. The program operates on a cohort model and has 5 full time faculty with 120 students who may participate in either a full-time or part-time cohort. The program prepares students for generalist social work practice with special emphasis on people of color and communities of color with a mission that concentrates on multicultural competence. This position requires expertise and practice experience with American Indian communities. We want to have someone on board by fall semester 2013.

Metropolitan State University, a member of the Minnesota State Colleges and Universities System, serves approximately 10,000 students in the greater Twin Cities Metropolitan area. We are the most diverse university in the system, with approximately 29% of our students coming from communities of color. Salary is commensurate with education and experience, and is determined by the salary placement process as outlined in the Inter Faculty Organization (IFO) Master Agreement

Qualified applicants are required to attach the following documents to their online application:

- Letter of application which details how skills and experience fit the requirements of the position.
- Curriculum vita.
- Three reference letters documenting effective social work practice. Names of four (4) professional references with addresses, email addresses and telephone numbers.
- Transcripts (Unofficial copies are acceptable. If selected/hired, official copies will be required.)

Responsibilities:

- Teach in the core social work curriculum in areas such as social welfare history and policy, social research, human behavior in the social environment, generalist social work practice and comparative racial/ethnic analysis.
- Participate in social work program policy development and implementation.
- Advise social work students from culturally diverse populations.
- Participate in departments, college, faculty and university committees and initiatives.

Minimum Qualifications:

Master's degree in social work and five years of social work practice experience

Additional Qualifications:

- Experience in supervision of social work practice and/or field instruction.
- Expertise and social work practice experience with American Indian communities.
- Significant experience serving a culturally, ethnically diverse community.

Preferred Qualifications:

- B.S.W. field instruction experience
- Social work classroom teaching experience
- Doctorate in social work or related discipline
