

## Position Announcement

The North Carolina State University Department of Social Work invites applications for the position of Director for BSW Program and tenured Associate Professor beginning August 16, 2014. Primary teaching areas are research and social work practice for the BSW program. Additional faculty responsibilities include regular advising of students, curriculum and program development, active research and publication, university service, and community engagement. The Department of Social Work is accredited by the Council on Social Work Education (CSWE). The Commission on Accreditation of CSWE is the sole body authorized to accredit BSW and MSW program in the United States.

North Carolina State University, College of Humanities & Social Sciences, Department of Social Work (<http://socialwork.chass.ncsu.edu/>) offers baccalaureate and master's level education to a diverse student body of approximately 250 students. We are located in the Research Triangle Area, in Raleigh, North Carolina. The BSW generalist social work curriculum prepares graduates for entry-level social work practice, leadership, the delivery and evaluation of health and human services, as well as future graduate study. NC State is committed to excellence in research, scholarship, teaching, community extension and engagement. Excellence in teaching and scholarship are the primary criteria in promotion and tenure considerations. The search will begin immediately.

Candidates must attach a letter outlining interest in and qualifications for the position, research and teaching areas, teaching philosophy and strategies, and research/professional accomplishments, as well as a scholarly writing sample, and curriculum vitae. Finalists will also be required to submit a copy of his/her transcript for highest degree earned.
