All applicants for employment will be required to produce as a part of the application process, proof of employment authorization and positive proof of identification.

TELEMEDICINE PSYCHIATRIC PROVIDER (P #1499) – A.H. - EAST TEXAS BEHAVIORAL HEALTHCARE NETWORK, LUFKIN, TEXAS

GENERAL DESCRIPTION: Provision of psychiatric services to adults (may include some child and adolescent coverage). No relocation is necessary for this position.

EDUCATION:

Required: Completion of accredited program in your area of specialty.

LICENSES/CERTIFICATIONS:

Required: Licensed in the State of Texas as a Physician, Advanced Practice Nurse or Physician Assistant.

Preferred: Current unrestricted Texas license to practice medicine; Board eligibility in Child & Adolescent Psychiatry. Board Certification in Child & Adolescent Psychiatry; Board Certification in General Psychiatry.

PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS: Visual and auditory skills sufficient to evaluate, treat, and monitor patients; mobility required to bend, reach, lift (up to 50 pounds) while assisting patients, complete Satori Alternative to Managing Aggressive Behavior (SAMA), carrying charts (equipment); and fine motor skills for legible handwriting and driving.

DIRECTOR OF COMMUNICATIONS (P #1556) – S.R. – CENTRAL ADMINISTRATION, LUFKIN, TEXAS

GENERAL DESCRIPTION: The Director of Communications will manage the Center's corporate communication, media relations, social media and marketing efforts and help Burke Center fulfill and grow its brand in East Texas. This position will serve as the primary "message manager" for the Center. Excellent written and oral communication skills are mandatory. CENTRALIZED INTAKE THERAPIST (P #1219) - N.T. - CENTRALIZED INTAKE UNIT, LUFKIN, TEXAS

GENERAL DESCRIPTION: The Centralized Intake THERAPIST *will be part of the Centralized Intake Team and will be responsible for providing* diagnostics and intake assessments for the twelve (12) county area. This person will also be responsible for completing all Intake duties which include determining if presenting individuals meet priority population criteria for admission to Center services and/or require referral to community providers. Will perform emergency mental health assessments to determine if presenting individuals require crisis resolution or admission to inpatient hospitalization. Will answer crisis line calls as part of the crisis line rotation during normal business hours. Will consult with Centralized Intake Service Director, MH clinic Service Directors or team leader to coordinate scheduling, dispatch, triage and appropriate disposition of assessments and interventions. Will complete prescribed assessment instruments work according to established guidelines and standards. Will complete legal paperwork to coordinate inpatient hospitalizations as required. Will document activities according to required Center, Medicaid and Accreditation standards. Travel to the outline counties will be required. Will report to Centralized Intake Service Director/team leader

EDUCATION:

Required: Master's degree in Social Work, Psychology, Marriage and Family Therapy or counseling from an accredited college or university.

EXPERIENCE:

REGISTERED NURSE (P #1421) – K.B. – MENTAL HEALTH EMERGENCY CENTER

GENERAL DESCRIPTION: Registered Nurses are part of a multidisciplinary treatment team and are responsible for providing nursing care services to acutely mentally ill adult residents at the Mental Health Emergency Center. This program operates 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Under the clinical direction of a physician and Nursing Clinical Coordinator, duties include giving injections, administering oral medications, completing admission and other nursing assessments, completing medication consents, taking inquiry calls from the community regarding potential admissions, reviewing medical records to determine appropriateness for admission, coordinating psychiatric assessments utilizing telehealth equipment, coordinating emergency healthcare needs with other medical care providers, and maintaining constructive relationships with stakeholders in the community. Other responsibilities include inventory of medications, patient education, documentation, supervising LVN staff and mental health specialist staff, and other duties as assigned.

EDUCATION:

Required: Graduation from an accredited school of nursing and licensed as a Registered Nurse by the Texas State Board of Nurse Examiners.

EXPERIENCE:

Required: At least 1 year experience as a licensed LVN or RN working in a medical or acute mental health setting

Preferred: At least 6 months experience working in a mental health setting

LICENSES/CERTIFICATIONS:

Required: Texas license as a Registered Nurse.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION: The Service Coordinator will be responsible for working with individuals with intellectual and/or developmental disabilities residing in nursing facilities. The Service Coordinator is responsible for convening and facilitating the individual's service planning team; facilitating the development of the individual's service plan, facilitating revisions to the service plan as needed and facilitating the coordination of services and supports between the individual's service plan and the nursing facility's plan of care. The Service Coordinator is also responsible for completing PASRR Evaluations, interfacing with nursing facility staff and for educating the individual/LAR/families of living options available in the community and in working with the individual who is transitioning to the community, including the development of a Community Living Discharge Plan. Travel is required.

EDUCATION/EXPERIENCE/SKILLS:

Required: High school diploma or equivalent and two years paid employment experience as a Case Manager in a state or federally funded Parent Case Management Program or HCS program OR have been authorized by a local IDD authority to provide service coordination prior to April 1st, 1999.

Preferred: Bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university in a Human Services field with one year experience working with individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities.

LICENSE/CERTIFICATIONS:

HEALTH INSURANCE LOCAL NAVIGATOR (P #1558) – J.S – CONSUMER BENEFITS, LUFKIN, TEXAS (SPECIAL GRANT)

GENERAL DESCRIPTION: The Local Navigator position will provide local community outreach and education to raise awareness about the marketplace, and will refer consumers to health insurance ombudsmen and consumer assistance programs. Position will assist consumer enrollment in coverage through the marketplace and potentially qualify for an insurance affordability program. Navigators will perform all the required navigator duties and will attend the required 30-hour training, along with other training sessions arranged by the program administrators. This position will be based at the Lufkin or Nacogdoches Offices. It is anticipated that the grant funding for this position will last until September 30th, 2014.

EDUCATION:

These programs operate 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Duties will include, but may not be limited to the following: monitoring acutely mentally ill adults; intervening when necessary to prevent clients from escalating; facilitating client engagement in treatment services; prompting, supervising and assisting clients in performing basic activities of daily living; and generally observing, documenting, and reporting client conditions and behaviors. May also transport clients to other medical services in the community, when necessary. Will perform services in accordance with Center and Medicaid standards and requirements. Emotional maturity, self-discipline, flexibility, and good verbal skills are a must. These programs are currently located in Lufkin. Performs under the direct supervision of the charge nurse and general supervision of the Psychiatric Nurse Manager.

Preferred: Experience working with adults with mental illness.

LICENSES/CERTIFICATIONS:

Required: Valid Texas driver's license.
