The School is part of the College of Allied Health Sciences at the UC Academic Health Center; we anticipate opportunities for interdisciplinary research and teaching. UC is ranked one of America's top 25 public research universities. It is an urban university of 14 colleges, 300-plus degree programs, and a diverse student body of more than 41,000. The School of Social Work offers BSW and MSW degrees to more than 400 students. Programs include a Title-IV-E Child Welfare program for both BSW and MSW students; a joint MSW/JD program; and School Social Worker certification at the MSW level.

Minimum Qualifications: Candidates must have an MSW degree, a minimum of two years post-MSW experience, and an earned doctorate. This position requires a commitment to excellence in teaching at both the undergraduate and graduate levels, to research and scholarly publication, and to community engagement. Candidates must also have an extensive record of scholarship and significant research funding at the local, state, and federal levels.

Preferred Qualifications: Candidates with a PhD in Social Work or Social Welfare are preferred. Candidates with experience mentoring junior faculty, an interest in interdisciplinary collaboration, and expertise in the areas of mental health and/or policy are especially encouraged to apply.
