Faculty Position in Social Work. Rank (instructor or assistant professor, tenure track) and salary commensurate with credentials and experience. Position will begin August 15, 2012.

Qualifications. Instructor Rank - An MSW and 5 years of post-masters practice experience. Assistant Professor Rank (tenure-track) – An MSW and 2 years of post-masters practice experience, plus a doctorate in a related area (ABD considered). Some educational training or college teaching experience required. The individual should be open to engaging in alternative modes of instructional delivery that may include web-based courses, IVS, and offering courses at off-campus sites. The person selected must also be comfortable operating effectively in a diverse multi-ethnic/multi-cultural environment.

Primary Duties. Teaching BSW courses in Glasgow, KY (36 miles northeast of the main campus in Bowling Green). The successful candidate will also teach in Bowling Green, Elizabethtown, and/or Owensboro and have the ability to teach courses online. Desire to teach across the BSW curriculum with the ability to teach in two or more core areas. Potential opportunity to teach in the MSW program as well. This person will serve as the primary point person for the BSW program's new Glasgow initiative. In addition to teaching, the position will involve curriculum development, advising students, and performing university/public service, and/or research. If the successful candidate is a tenure track assistant professor, there is the possibility of collaborative and interdisciplinary scholarship as part of new clustered faculty positions with the WKU Clinical Education Complex (CEC). The CEC consists of programs designed to serve families and children with needs related to autism, early childhood education, family counseling, acquired brain injury, communication disorders, and family resources.
