Candidates with experience in macro practice (community practice, policy practice, and/or organizational management and administration) and/or in micro practice (direct practice with individuals and families in social service, social welfare, or clinical environments) will be considered as our growing Department is actively building our micro- and macro-practice faculty. Regardless of specializations, candidates must have competence to teach across the undergraduate and graduate social work curricula. Candidates who are ABD will be considered, but all doctoral degree requirements must be met by September 15, 2014.
