**FACULTY POSITIONS**

Applications are invited for four tenure-track faculty positions in Phoenix and Tucson to start Fall, 2012. One position is at the Associate Professor rank to lead our Tucson Component. Three additional positions at the Assistant Professor rank are intended in Phoenix or Tucson to build on our focus of developing culturally sensitive practice and policies for diverse families and communities. Expertise in health and health disparities, behavioral health, or children and families is preferred, and experience in working with culturally diverse populations is especially valued. Interest in immigration and border issues, and related social problems, also is desirable.

Candidates must have an earned doctorate in social work or a related field by the starting date of appointment. An MSW is preferred. A promising scholarly research agenda that has the potential for external funding to support the program of research is essential, as is evidence of ability or potential for teaching at both the undergraduate and graduate levels. Ability to teach social work practice courses is highly valued.

Arizona State University School of Social Work offers the BSW, MSW and Ph.D. degrees, with locations in the ASU Downtown Phoenix campus and in Tucson. ASU is a leading research university committed to expanding educational access, use-inspired and community embedded research, and using research and teaching to transform society. The SSW is a vibrant community of scholar-teachers committed to having a racially and culturally diverse faculty and student body. The School's curriculum, research, and community partnerships emphasize understanding and respect for the unique social, political, and cultural diversity of the Southwest.

The School engages in collaborative projects across the State of Arizona and is an active participant in the diverse urban and community life of Phoenix and Tucson.

Salary is commensurate with qualifications. Early application is advised. Candidates must submit a curriculum vitae, names and addresses of three professional references, a statement of research agenda and teaching interests, teaching evaluations (if available), and no more than two samples of written/published material.
