



Position: Assistant Professor of Social Work

Minimum Qualifications: MSW; completed Doctorate in Social Work preferred. Eligible for social work licensure in New Jersey. BSW and/or MSW practice, leadership and/or teaching experience; at least two years of post MSW practice experience or three to five years of extensive research experience in both qualitative and quantitative research methodology as well as participatory research and evaluation; excellent communicator; collegial work style and advocacy commitment for the interests of the School and the profession; demonstrated record of scholarship, teaching and service sufficient to warrant a tenure track appointment as an Assistant Professor. Competence and interest in any area of social work practice with a strong teaching record in social work research. The successful candidate must demonstrate a serious commitment to research and the advancement of social justice and human rights.

Duties: Teaching across the curriculum in both BSW and MSW courses, particularly research and statistics, assisting the School in meeting all aspects of CSWE reaccreditation guidelines, conducting ongoing research and writing, advising students, and collaborating on University and School issues and committees.

The University: Monmouth is a private non sectarian university located in West Long Branch, New Jersey. The University is located less than one mile from the Atlantic Ocean, and one and one half hours from either New York City or Philadelphia. The student body is diverse. Although most students come from New Jersey, 19 States and 35 nations are represented.

The School of Social Work has maintained an accredited BSW Program since 1975 and in Fall 1998 began its MSW Program (accredited 2000) with concentrations in Clinical Practice with Families and Children and International and Community Development.
