Applications are invited for a full-time nine-month non-tenure faculty position as Director of Field Education. Faculty appointment begins August 2012, with the opportunity to begin June 1, 2012 (with summer stipend). The Director of Field Education reports to the Director of the Worden School of Social Service. The position involves coordination of all Field Education programs and activities as the primary responsibility (.75 FTE), as well as teaching at the BSW and MSW levels (.25 FTE). Additional responsibilities include service and scholarship activities that support the institution's mission. Salary is competitive and commensurate with qualifications and experience.

Expertise in cross-cultural social work practice with emphasis on Hispanic families and children desired, as is experience with social service agencies serving Hispanic families and children. Bilingual/bicultural experience with Spanish-speaking populations is also strongly desired.

Qualifications: A Master of Social Work Degree; a doctorate is preferred, either in social work or an aligned academic discipline. The successful candidate must have at least two years post-MSW full-time practice experience, with eligibility for social work licensure in Texas. Documented experience in teaching both at the BSW and MSW levels and across the curriculum; experience with institutional application of information technology; record of publication and scholarly activity.
