This individual will also be working with external constituents, social work agencies, community members, program directors, field-based coordinators, and individuals in clinical environments. Summer teaching is a possibility.</p>
Skills or Experience Needed	<p>Applicants must have a Masters in Social Work (MSW) from a CSWE accredited program, or a Doctorate (PhD) in social work or related field (ABD will be considered). If ABD employed as Instructor, position will become the Assistant Professor. Two years post-MSW experience is also required. Social Work licensure in Texas preferred, ability to be licensed within a year would be required. Teaching and research potential needs to be substantial.</p>
