**TENURE-TRACK FACULTY POSITIONS AVAILABLE
January or August, 2012**

The Indiana University School of Social Work invites applications for two tenure-track positions at the assistant professor level on the South Bend campus in north central Indiana. These are ten-month, academic year appointments with responsibility for teaching, research, and service. Successful candidates will be expected to teach across the BSW and MSW curricula as well as occasional classes in partner campus locations.

Essential qualifications include: An earned doctorate in social work or a related field; an MSW degree from a CSWE-accredited program; and, at least two years of post-MSW practice experience. Successful candidates should also have a well-articulated research and publication agenda as well as demonstrated interest in seeking external grants to support scholarly activities. Preference will be given to applicants who demonstrate teaching experience at the BSW and/or MSW level and have experience or interest in online and distance education delivery methods. Preference will also be given to candidates with teaching interests in the following areas: Advanced clinical practice and policy in mental health and addictions; social work generalist practice; basic research methods and practice evaluation research; and, executive leadership practice.

Salary is competitive and commensurate with qualifications and experience. Start date may be January or August, 2012.

The Indiana University School of Social Work (IUSSW), headquartered in Indianapolis, has a long and distinguished history that began in 1911. IUSSW offers the BSW, MSW and PhD in Social Work and the AS and BS in Labor Studies. The School has approximately 65 full-time faculty members on seven campuses with five faculty members in residence in South Bend. The School enrolls nearly 1,500 students in its programs statewide with approximately 125 part-time MSW students on the South Bend campus. At the present time, the Mental Health and Addictions Concentration is the only MSW option at this campus location. However, based on potential demand, the School anticipates expanding program offerings in South Bend at the MSW and BSW levels.

Indiana University South Bend is a comprehensive state institution with 7700 students and 292 full-time faculty serving the urban, suburban, and rural communities of north central Indiana and southwestern Michigan.
