The School of Social Work invites applications for an MSW Program Director with a proposed starting date of August 16, 2012. This is a full time, tenured faculty appointment at the rank of Associate or Full Professor with a 50% release for administrative duties. Candidates must have an established record of funded research, scholarship and teaching, and must meet the University's requirements for that rank.

Responsibilities:

Curriculum oversight and administration for the MSW Program
Chairs the MSW Program Committee and supports the concentration committees (Health, Mental Health, Schools, Children, Youth and Family Services, and Advocacy, Leadership, and Social Change)
Ensures compliance with CSWE accreditation standards
Oversees recruitment activities, admissions, student support, and field education
Coordinates with the Associate Dean regarding curriculum and assessment

Qualifications:

Ph.D. and MSW are required, preferably a Ph.D. in Social Work. Candidates must be familiar with CSWE accreditation standards. Preference will be given to candidates with prior experience in administering either a BSW or MSW program or who have prior experience with CSWE accreditation, such as serving as a site visitor.
