ASSISTANT or ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR (Tenure Track)

The School of Social Work at Boise State University invites applicants for a tenure-track position as an Assistant or Associate Professor to teach in our CSWE-accredited BSW and MSW programs starting in Fall 2012. Salary is competitive based on qualifications and experience.

Duties Include:

- Teaching across the curriculum in an integrated program serving undergraduate and graduate students
- Research and scholarly activities
- Student advising, active participation on school and university committees
- Service to the social work profession, the community, and the State of Idaho

At a minimum candidates should have:

- Ph.D. in Social Work or a related field, or have an earned doctorate by August 2012.
- An MSW from a CSWE accredited program
- Demonstrate a record of or strong potential for classroom teaching and an ongoing record of research and scholarly publication commensurate with rank.

The preferred candidate will have:

- An MSW and two years post-MSW direct practice experience.
- Teaching expertise in the areas of research and statistics, social welfare policy, and macro practice.

Boise State University is a comprehensive, metropolitan university serving a diverse population through its undergraduate and graduate programs, research, and state and regional public service. Boise State is the largest university in Idaho, enrolling approximately 20,000 students. The School of Social Work currently enrolls more than 350 undergraduate majors and 175 full- and part-time MSW candidates. The MSW Program provides both two-year and advanced-standing program options and offers MSW education on four Idaho campuses. The school recently approved and is implementing a certificate in Refugee Services.

Approximately half of Idaho's 1.3 million residents live in the Boise metropolitan area. As the state's capital city and population center, Boise is a hub of government, social services, business, the arts, health care, industry and technology, a great place to live and work offering a wide range of employment opportunities for spouses or significant others. Boise's vibrant down-town district is in walking distance of the BSU campus. Boise is headquarters to all of the state's major social services and to several major international corporations. The area affords easy access to rivers, mountains, and lakes. The scenic Boise River flows through campus. Excellent alpine and Nordic skiing are only 45 minutes away. The Boise State Morrison Center for Performing Arts hosts the Boise Philharmonic, the Boise Opera Company, the American Festival Ballet and Broadway musical touring companies.
