Job Description	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provides counseling to adults, children and the family impacted by family violence. • Ensure professional case records are maintained in accordance with agency policy. • Assist the Director of Therapy (DOT) in the development of community education programs focused in the areas of domestic violence and sexual assault victimization. • Comply with the Licensed Professional Counselor Act and the Texas Professional Social Work Act and ensure staff compliance. • Work with the DOT to provides on-going assessment and evaluation of the clinical program to the Executive Director to ensure that client needs, agency standards and funding requirements are met. • Provide crisis intervention services to clients and complete safety planning. • Facilitates counseling program update/case management meetings for all in-house and contracted counselors. • Actively cultivates and maintains collaborative working relationships with social-service and/or law enforcement agencies in the community that assist the clients of the Crisis Center. • Monitor and provide feedback to support groups; also participating in or hosting support group as needed. • Provides management of the daily operations of the Crisis Center and supervises staff, including interviewing, hiring and evaluating job performance. • Works closely with all of the non-residential and residential programs to coordinate services to clients. • Work with DOT to create, administer and reviews client surveys statistics and feedback from programs to ensure satisfaction rates are above 90%. • Prioritizes the best use of evidence-based practices, including researching programming trends and current practices being used in other similar service providers; monitors trends and makes informed decisions regarding service provisions. • Work with DOT, overseeing the development and implementation of an internship program, overseeing and coordinating the program once it's up and running, assigning interns to various departments, and managing site supervisors. Acts as the liaison between Crisis Center and the educational institutions. • Work with DOT to provide oversight for MSW interns and provides agency and client educational opportunities to facilitate optimal student growth and development. • Participates in weekly, monthly, and annual employee and staff meetings and trainings. • Maintains current professional knowledge of crisis intervention, case management and counseling for domestic violence victims; keeps up to date information for community resources available to clients. <p>Other Duties:</p>
