<b>Job Description</b>	<p>The Faillace Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences at UTHealth Houston's Nurturing Resilience Initiative is seeking a clinician with an interest in contributing to innovative programs focused on improving access to mental health care in Fort Bend County. Clinicians should have a strong interest in interdisciplinary work as they will receive supervision and mentorship from a team of psychologists, child psychiatrists, social workers, and professional counselors all co-located within the department.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Provides indirect services to patients. Acts as an advocate for the patient/family with the treatment team.</li> <li>• Provides direct services to children/families via clinical and educational interventions to be utilized with youth in after-school and community-based programs for parents of young children engaged in evidence-based attachment-related parenting programming.</li> <li>• Provides oversight of participants' progress; this is accomplished through assessment and feedback to participants, the clinical team, and community partners.</li> <li>• Works with a multidisciplinary treatment team to develop individualized treatment. Works closely with supervisors in identifying diagnoses to assist in the treatment process. Develops a treatment plan that will support the patient's ongoing recovery and development with supervisors.</li> <li>• Assesses the psychosocial functioning of youth and parents throughout the treatment program; conducts interviews with patients and significant others to determine assets as well as challenges to optimal patient functioning both while in the program.</li> <li>• Establishes and maintains relationships with community resources to assist with patients' medical participant's needs for ongoing support.</li> <li>• Refers patients and families to community resources.</li> <li>• Resides in the Houston-Metro area and can be prepared to deliver in-person interventions and trainings in Fort Bend and Harris County. Requires current driver's license. All mileage will be reimbursed.</li> <li>• Participates in invited community events (i.e., health fairs, mental health trainings, presentations, program recruitment) duties as assigned.</li> </ul>
