



**Change to Undergraduate Catalogue** (Submitted by: Marta Fairclough – Director of Spanish Undergraduate Studies, MCL)

**From the current Undergraduate Catalogue, p. 233:**

**1505: Intensive Elementary Spanish Cr. 5. (5-0).** Prerequisite: placement test or permission of instructor. Credit for SPAN 1505 may not be applied toward a degree by students who have credit for SPAN ~~1501~~ or 1502. Designed for students who enter with two or more years of high school Spanish or equivalent, but are not prepared to do work at the intermediate level. May also be taken by students with strong proficiency in another romance language.

**Proposed change: delete the words “1501 or” from course description.**

**1505: Intensive Elementary Spanish Cr. 5. (5-0).** Prerequisite: placement test or permission of instructor. Credit for SPAN 1505 may not be applied toward a degree by students who have credit for SPAN 1502. Designed for students who enter with two or more years of high school Spanish or equivalent, but are not prepared to do work at the intermediate level. May also be taken by students with strong proficiency in another romance language.

**Justification:**

SPAN 1505 is an intensive first-year Spanish course that reviews the material from the first semester before moving on to the contents of the second semester. A number of students who enroll in SPAN 1505 are transfer students who earned credit for SPAN 1501 or equivalent at other institutions. These students are placed into 1505 by exam or by instructor's recommendation because they can benefit from the review. However, the wording in our current undergraduate catalogue does not allow us to accept the transfer credit for the first semester of Spanish that they earned from other institutions.
