Updating Catalog Information on Study Abroad

The Department of Hispanic Studies, in conjunction with the Department of Modern and Classical Languages, is requesting that changes be made to the information in the Undergraduate Catalog concerning Programs Abroad. We are requesting three changes.

- 1. That the Undergraduate Catalog reflect the split between the Department of Modern and Classical Languages and the Department of Hispanic Studies.
- 2. That the Undergraduate Catalog incorporate information on "Special Programs" that are being offered through the Department of Hispanic Studies to Latin America and Spain.
- 3. The Department of Hispanic Studies has encountered a limited number of cases in which students wish to complete the entirety or most of their requirements for the major or minor in Spanish through study abroad programs. Right now there is nothing official to limit the number of classes our majors and minors can take abroad and apply to the major or minor. Under the current policies, programs offered through the Office of Study Abroad or classes taken though one of our Special Programs count as in-house credits, not transfer credits, so that the residency requirement does not cover this issue. We would like to add the requirement that Hispanic Studies majors must take a minimum of 15 credit hours

of the 27 hours required for the major, and 9 credit hours of the 15 required for the minor, excluding credit by exam and study abroad in residency on campus with the Department of Hispanic Studies.

Summer Programs Abroad in Chinese, French, and Spanish

The summer program in Chinese is academically vigorous and culturally enriching. It offers intensive course work and extensive travel on weekends. Students may take up to three courses (nine credit hours) toward the Chinese minor or Chinese Studies major in approximately five weeks while in Beijing. The program offers language courses of all levels and culture/literature courses taught in English. All courses have the same curriculum as the courses offered on the UH campus.

A summer program of study in France allows qualified students to earn residence credit in French at various undergraduate levels. The program is directed by a full-time faculty member of the department. A minimum of one year of college French, or equivalent, is required. Contact the department for more information.

Through its summer programs in Latin America and Spain, the department offers up to six semester hours of credit in Spanish language, civilization, and literature. These programs are directed by University of Houston faculty members, and costs are modest. Undergraduate and graduate students of Spanish and allied specialties are eligible to apply for admission. Programs usually coincide with the 6 Week-First Session (Summer I). For more information, consult the program director in the department. $\Box\Box$ In addition, the department encourages students interested in studying abroad during the regular academic year to consult with the department's undergraduate advisor.

Minor in Spanish for the Business Professions

Students minoring in Spanish for the Business Professions must complete at least 15 semester hours in Spanish, all of which must be advanced, including <u>SPAN 3341</u>, <u>3342</u>, and <u>4341</u>. Nine semester hours must be completed in residence <u>with the Department of Hispanic Studies not including credit by exam or study abroad</u>. Students must earn a 2.50 minimum cumulative grade point average on all Spanish courses attempted in the minor at the University of Houston.
