The HDFS program area is submitting 4 revised degree plans and the minor plan for

In order to clarify the differences between the degree plans, the major changes are listed

below.

- 1. The Computer Literacy Course has been eliminated from all degree plan:
  - a. This requirement was originally (10 years ago) intended to ensure that our students had sufficient computer literacy in common programs, i.e., Word, Excel, Powerpoint, for jobs in the human services field. Currently, HDFS courses require a high degree of computer literacy in many common applications, culminating with production of an electronic portfolio, rendering this requirement obsolete.
- 2. We have removed CUST 3320: Multicultural Environments, from all degree plans.
  - a. For the previous last two years, this course has been cross-listed with another required course, HDFS 4315: Culture and Diversity
  - b. It will likely not be taught regularly in the future.
- 3. We have added HDFS 4318: The Human Ecology of Parenting to the required major core for every degree plan.
  - a. Students are required to take multiple courses in human development, but only one in families. This addition strengthens the "Family Relationships" component of our major.
  - b. Many internship sites involve work with parents, making this course particularly relevant.
- 4. HDFS BS degree plan with Nonprofit Leadership Alliance Certification
  - This plan previously required fewer SCH in HDFS than other plans. In a recognition that these students are working in setting in which health related knowledge is particularly important, we are requiring that these students take at least one Health course from the list of Health electives.
  - b. We are raising the SCHs in the area elective requirement from 12 to 15. Both the HDFS BA and BS plan with minor require 15 hours of area electives.
- 5. HDFS BS degree plan with double major
  - a. In order to accommodate the addition of Parenting as an elective, we are reducing the number of SCH required in area electives from 15 to 12.

6. We are adding EPSY 3300: Educational Psychology and EPSY 3360: Individuals with Disabilities to the courses listed on the minor degree plan. These are already required as part of the HDFS major.
